

## ENVIRONMENTAL ENRICHMENT FOR INDOOR CATS

Owners are becoming increasingly aware of the benefits of keeping cats inside

The benefits are:

- That cats cannot kill or injure wildlife
- ♦ The neighbours and their animals will have full residential enjoyment
- That cats are less likely to be injured by traffic, abused by children, adopted or stolen
- They are less likely to catch feline AIDS and feline LEUKAEMIA
- ♦ The cats will be home when their owners return

Cats can be kept indoors in a humane and satisfying manner. They can be given a daily environment, which provides complexity, unpredictability and choice - the things that make life interesting. This can be done by:

- Providing areas such as shelves, window ledges or screened enclosure where they can lie at different times of the day to get the sun, fresh air, and a view of the world outside.
- Providing a scratch post. This should have a fabric which claws can be drawn out without snagging, firmly wrapped around a piece of wood (about 600mm high x 100mm wide x 100mm deep) which is upright in a base of wood.
- Taking for an excursion outside your home in your arms or on a harness.
- Providing as much TLC (tender loving care) as possible by having them on your lap, carrying around, stroking, and brushing them with a soft brush.
- Playing hide and seek with them.
- Blowing non- toxic soap bubbles for them to chase and burst
- Providing an indoor tree with platforms and angles, on which they can climb and rest at different heights.
- Throwing hollow plastic golf balls leaving them around the house.
- Hiding treats such as dried cat food around the house for them to hunt and discover.
- Providing a regular supply of card board boxes or paper bags for them to explore
- Having plant pots containing grass, or catnip for them to chew.
- Get them used to chasing feathery toys, golf balls, laser pointers, kitty kongs, scrunched up newspaper.
