LEPTO 4 way VACCINE IMPORTANT INFORMATION HERE NOW!!!

You and your farm team can now be protected from the Lepto Pacifica strain. The vaccine is called Lepto 4-Way, which is the existing 3-Way with *L. pacifica* added, now in stock.

Why should you use it?

- *L.pacifica* infects cows, and survives and spreads in this species, NOT rats. It doesn't make the cows sick, but can, and does, infect humans, with more severe symptoms than other strains.
- Most *L. pacifica* human lepto cases are found in farmers they are calling it the "Dairy Farmer Disesase" The other strains rarely infect dairy farmers now due to widespread vaccination.
- Northland has the highest percentage (>50%) of herds in NZ found to be secreting the *L. pacifica* strain
- Northland also has the highest number of herds with antibodies to it meaning its has been in those herds (>80%)
- L. pacifica loves wet conditions and high water tables something Northland excels at!

The Programme:

All cattle need a sensitising dose followed by a booster 4 – 6 weeks later the *first* year, then annual boosters.

Calves: First dose is given at 12 weeks of age, with a booster 4-6 weeks later, and a "catch up" dose when the herd gets done. Clostridial vaccinations (5-in-1) will need to be given seperately as there is not a 7-in-1 equivalent vaccine including the new strain.

Herds and heifers will need TWO vaccinations 4 – 6 weeks apart, with the new vaccine this year, then annual boosters thereafter.
